A BRIEF HISTORY NARROWAY BAPTIST CHURCH 1980 - 1975 ROUTE 3. DALIAS, GEORGIA BUNGET GLENN HOLLAND, J.D. Marietta, Georgia

There is tradition to the effect that the late Mrs. Sarah furner Murray was the wife of the late Mr. James Murray and they owned a female slave by the name of Miss Sue Powell. No. James Murray purchased all of Land Lot Numbers 440, 441 and 496 of the 3rd District, 3rd Section of Paulding County, Georgia, from the late Mr. John L. Rowland by Warranty Deed dated October 29, 1852, recorded in Deed Book Z, page 241, Office of Clerk, Superior Court of Paulding County, Georgia. Tradition is that Mr. James Murray was a gold miner and farmer. The late Mr. James Murray was a Private in Company A. 40th Regiment, Georgia Volunteer Infantry and he was captured in Cobb County. Georgia, by the Federal Troops in July, 1864, and confined as a prisoner of war in Camp Douglas Prison, Illinois, where he died on October 30, 1864. Miss Sue Powell, after she became smancipated, chose to continue to reside on the farm of Mrs. Sarah Turner Murray, Tradition is that Miss Powell and Mrs. Murray were very kind, honest, active Christian people, Mrs. Murray was especially fend of the BIBLE and good preaching. On September 25, 1880, Mrs. Serah Turner Murray conveyed title to a two acre tract of land located in Land Lot 496 of the 3rd District, 3rd Section of Paulding County, Georgia, to Messrs, Wiley Abner, Thomas A. Hughes and Augustus Lindsey as Trustees of the Baptist Church at Narroway by Warranty Deed recorded in Deed Book Q, page 676, Office of Clerk. Superior Court of Paulding County, Georgia. Tradition is to the effect that Mrs. Murray desired the church to be called the "Narroway Baptist Church" and that one of her favorite verses of scripture is found in ST, MATTHEW 7:14 and is as follows: atrait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life. and few there be that find it and she named the church in honor of the eternal truth contained in the foregoing verse of scripture.

THE OLD CHURCH BUILDINGS

Unfortunately most of the old records of the church were destroyed by fire when the home of a former clerk burned in 1901. Tradition is to the effect that the first religious services were conducted under a bush arbor on the two acre tract in 1880 and construction of the first church building was completed in 1881. The original trustees of the church were named in the above-mentioned deed and according to tradition the three trustees, Mrs. Sarah Turner Murray and Miss Sue Powell were five of the constitutional members of the church. Num members of the church procured 2 3/5 acres in Land Lot Numbers 496 and 513 adjoining the original two acre tract from Mrs. Ruby P. McMichen by warranty Deed dated June 25, 1963, recorded in Deed Book 4-8, page 504, Office of Clerk, Superior Court of Paulding County, Georgia, The two land lots were drawn in the Cherokee dold Lot Lottery of 1832 by the following named persons: "Land Lot 496, John N. Moore, Wilhites, Elbert" and "Land Lot 513, silas S. Starr, Hodges, Newton."

THE NEW CHURCH BUILDING

On September 17, 1965, the members of the church decided that the membership of the church had grown too large for the church building of 1913 and the Rev. Jesse Green Tibbitts was elected Moderator and he appointed the following-named persons to serve on the Building Committee: Mr. Hugh Carruth, the late Mr. Elbert Chester Womack, Mr. Jack Powell and Mr. Raymond A. Thomason and Mr. Hugh Carruth was chosen to serve as Treasurer. The Building Committee appointed a Finance Committee named as follows: Mrs. Mildred Turner Womack, Mr. J. C. Thomason, Mrs. Edna Hornbuckle Thomason and Mrs. Christine Cochran Carruth. By December 13, 1965, a total of \$8,081.61 had been collected in cash and the Rev. Jesse Green Tibbitts appointed a Board of Directors or Trustees named as follows: Mr. Thomas Hershel Tibbitts, Rev. J. Hollis Tibbitts, Mr. J. C. Thomason, the late Mr. Wiley Ratteree, Mr. Hugh Carruth, Mr. Marvin H. Dudley and Mr. S. J. Corley. The members of the Board of Directors or Trustees borrowed sufficient funds (to supplement the said \$8,081.61) from the Citizens Bank of Dallas, Georgia, and Mr. Clyde Wilson, contractor, commenced construction of the new church. The new building is constructed of brick exterior and has a beautiful white steeple and was completed on December 11, 1965. It is equipped with a modern heating system, new benches and a piano. The building and its contents and the tract of land have a combined fair market value in excess of \$50,000.00.

THE BAPTIZING HOLE AND OTHER DATA

According to the Rev. E. F. Corley, many years ago new members of the Narroway Baptist Church were baptized in various streams and that when he became a member of the church he was baptized in the beautiful, clear waters of The Pokey Hole (named in honor of a very famous. Christian female who was born a slave and whose name was Pocahontas) in Raccoon Creek in Land Lot 576 of the 3rd District, 3rd Section of Paulding County, Georgia. According to Rev. E.F. 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THE NEW HOPE BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

The Narroway Baptist Church became a member of the Tellapoosa Baptist Association in about 1881. The Tallapoosa Baptist Association was organized in 1885. PASTORS, CLERKS AND DEACONS

As was stated above, tradition is that the Narroway Baptist Church was founded in 1880 and five of the constitutional members of the church are as follows: Mrs. Sarah Turner Murray, Mr. Wiley Abner, Mr. Thomas A. Hughes, Mr. Augustus Lindsey and Miss Sue Powell. Since most of the church records back of 1902 were destroyed by fire. some of the information herein is oral history and was extended by several members of the church and special appreciation is extended to the Rev. William Maston Tibbitts, Rev. Jesse Green Tibbitts and Mrs. Christine Cochran Carruth. Also, the records from 1902 to date now in the possession of the Honorable Thomas Hershel Tibbitts, Clerk, are in excellent condition and appreciation is extended to him and his wife, Mrs. Letty Bone Tibbitts, for the kindness and cooperation which they have given in furnishing information from the church records in their possession.
