Dear Mrs. Austin:

I was reading your "The Georgia Frontier" Volumes I, II and III this past week at the Henry County Genealogical Society library. If you don't mind, I will share with you some of my families' information that does not appear as yours. I do not know who supplied the information to you and I hope that you are not offended by my letter. I really appreciate all of the research that you have done and all of the books that you have published to assist those of us who are daily researching our families.

In Vol. II, page 35, "Borders of Jackson County" the name Borders drew my attention. My great grandfather's step daughter, Arie, married John H. Borders, born May 1867, on November 18, 1889 in Banks Co., Georgia. One of Arie's maternal aunts, Elizabeth Wells White married Lafayette H. Borders, born 1827, on November 14, 1852 in Jackson Co., Ga. I have that information and some information about their children from the Christopher White Bible records. I have been researching those two Borders men but have not made any connection. Since John H. was born in May 1867, I have looked for him in the 1870 and 1880 census but have somehow managed not to find him. The first place I find him is in the 1900 census with Arie.

I noticed on the information that is in your book that an Isaac Borders had a son John H. Borders but since Isaac's will was probated in 1857 that could not be my John's father. In fact, according to information that I have found (but not researched myself) Isaac was the grandfather of Lafayette H. Borders who married Elizabeth Wells White. I really would like to find that connection.

In Vol. II, page 34, is a short article on the Bonners of Carroll and Clarke Counties. Thomas Bonner, the original Bonner that we can find (family sheets enclosed) is the father of Zadock Bonner born 1769, grandfather of Zadoc Bonner born 1804 and great grandfather of George A. Bonner born 1844. I must question whoever gave you the information on the Bonners. Thomas Bonner is the gggggrandfather of my husband and I have done much research on the Bonner Family.

I think Vol. II (now I can't remember if it was II or III), page 423 "Tucker of Virginia, ......" concerning "ol Dan Tucker". He was my great great grandfather's cousin. I joined the DAR on Harbert Tucker. My Dad began his research on the Tucker's in 1934 and continued until about 1975 and then I began researching, even unto this day. I am

enclosing Tucker family information, also. On page 423, "II. Thomas Tucker, Revolutionary War Soldier......" is someone that I have never run across nor do I have him in my Tucker database. I have two very good books on the Tuckers I am descended from and I have not found that person in either of them......so I am thinking he is from another branch of the many Tucker families. As far as I can find he was not a brother to the Daniel Tucker who died in Elbert County, Georgia. If I misread the book, please forgive me.

Thank you for taking your time to read my letter.

## Notes

Revolutionary Soldier. From "THE HERITAGE OF CHOCTAW CO., AL" book, page 106, "Thomas Bonner's Revolution War Records show he served in Roebucks Regiment SC and is recorded in War Records AA605, Roll #11, Frames 110 to 111, State of SC, Richland County" Carolyn Linder Lively, 2828 Linder Road, Butler, AL. 36904

Dr. James Bonner, professor of history and Bonner family researcher beginning in 1924, published the book, "Migration Pattern of the Descendents of Thomas Bonner - A Family History" copyright 1964. He does not give names of Thomas' parents. He does say that Thomas served during the Revolution in Roebuck's South Carolina regiment which was recruited in and around Newberry County, which was in the old Ninety-Six District. In June 1787 he sold some land and the deed record fixes June 1787 as the date which Thomas must have arrived in Georgia for it identified him as 'formerly of the state of South Caolina now of the state of Georgia'. Thomas came to Green County, Georgia from South Carolina. Through records, Dr. Bonner found that Thomas and his sons' land was in the Dove Creek community, between present day Monroe and Athens, Georgia. It was here that he died just after Christmas of 1804, at the approximate age of 60 years.
