The said Thomas Camp is the ancestor who assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of Patriot. Lyle in Jackson Co.; later moved to 13 or 14 miles east of Lawrenceville (now present resident of Wm. Jackson) where he resided until 1847. He left Gwinnett Co. and went to Polk Co., Ga.; living in Gwinnett Co. 40 years. He died 1859-60 near Cedartown, Ga. Was a Whig. Md. Elizabeth Jordan. They are buried in the same grave. Reared 12 children. The Wm. Jackson farm referred to as home of Hosea Camp is on the road from Auburn to County Line Consolidated School now Barrow, Co.

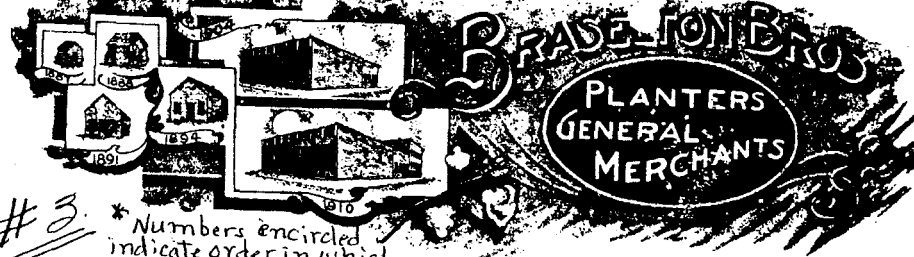

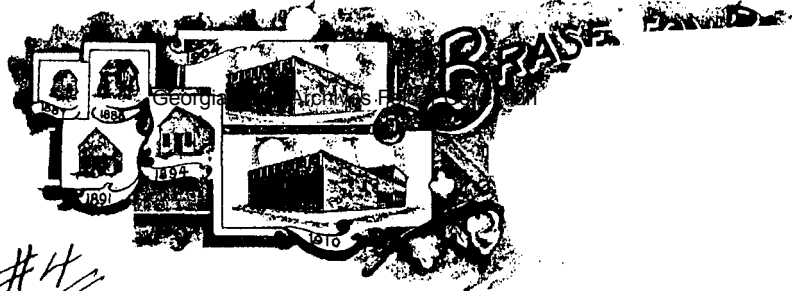
