CARAICHAEL GENERAL STORE. J. H. Carmichael & Sons sold "horse collars to coffins". The store stood at the crossing which was a streetcar stop on the Marketta-Atlanta line known as Carmichael's Crossing. Built by present owner's grandfather, J. H. Carmichael and operated a majority of the time by John Vinson Carmichael. This is the second Carmichael store that stood on this site. Building still stands without porch.


