Stanmore B. CARR arrived in Wilkinson Co., Georgia about the time Samuel CARR arrived and a history of Wilkinson by Davidson indicates they were related. Stanmore CARR was born in South Carolina about 1807 and named for Clerk of Court in Edgefield Co., S.C. 1806-1814, Stanmore Butler - acting sheriff in his brothers absence, a Captain in U.S. Army and Judge of Pleas & Bargains. The Butler family homeplace was out of Saluda, Big Creek neighborhood near the Butler Methodist Church.

There are no members of the CARR family listed in the Butler Family Genealogy so the CARR family who named their son Stanmore Butler CARR, may have been employed www.georgiaphone.com associated in some way to Stanmore Butler in the Army, Church, Masons or simply assisted by Butler in getting land in S.C. or Georgia. It is known that the CARR family came from Ireland so Butler could have helped them get here.

Stanmore (S.B) CARR married Mary Manderson 25 November 1836 in Wilkinson Co., GA and purchased 1/2 Land Lot in the 4th District 9 February 1837. This property was purchased from John N. Brady and adj. lands of William Bloodworth, Jefferson Sanders and John Eady. Stanmore's wife was the daughter of John & Susannah Murphy Manderson. Susannah married 2nd - Eli Wheeler, lived to be 100 and is buried in the Golden Family Cemetary in Wilkinson Co.

Stanmore CARR purchased Land Lot 113 in the 5th District 6 January 1852 from William Bales. He died 2 April 1882 and is buried at Mt. Carmel Cemetary in Wilkinson Co. with his wife Mary. The Children of Stanmore and Mary CARR:

Looking for parents of any of the Carrs listed above.
Information on their families and the families of their children follows:

Samuel CARR was on the York Co., S.C. Census of 1810 residing near a William CARR and was listed in the Georgia Land Grants - Book K.5 page 990 for 128 acres in Elbert Co., Georgia in 1816. He was on the Elbert Co., GA Census of 1820 and shown in the house - was another male in his age group(40-45) who could have been the William CARR on the 1810 York Co., S.C. Census. In the Georgia Land Lottery of 1820 he won and in 1826 awarded lot 29 in Dist. 12 of Habersham Co., Georgia, which he sold 20 Dec. 1826 to John CARR of Elbert Co., GA., apparently his brother.

Samuel purchased in Houston Co., GA in 1826, Land Lot 107 and in 1827 purchased lots 86, 87 & 295. He was on the Houston Co., GA Census of 1830 and in 1831 purchased Lots 18 & 138. In 1832 he purchased Lot 273.

Samuel married (2nd wife) Mary Ann Lovett of Houston Co., GA - born 1812 in N.C. and sold 1/2 Lot 18 March 18, 1833. He purchased Lot 322 Oct. 7, 1833 and was living in Wilkinson Co., GA when he sold this lot April 1, 1836. He was on the Wilkinson Co., Census of 1840 in Dist. 327 near Stanmore CARR. The Census shows Samuel (age 50-60), wife (20-30), 1 male (20-30), probably son by 1st wife, 1 female (5-10) and 2 females (under 5), daughters by 2nd wife.

Samuel died in 1842-43 and the estate was settled between his wife, Mary Ann (Lovett) CARR and Hiram P. CARR, apparently his son by 1st wife.

Samuel CARR's widow, Mary Ann Lovett CARR, married Robert Johnson (his 2nd wife) on 22 September 1844 and brought with her the twin daughters age 6 and another daughter age 11 of she and Samuel CARR. The 1850 Wilkinson Co., GA Census shows:

Sarah Ann CARR 12 (Twin - Married James Cross 1 October 1854)

Elizabeth CARR 17 (Married Samuel Merideth(Meridith) 28 February 1847)

James H. Johnson 11 (Son of Robert Johnson & 1st wife)

Isaac F. Johnson 9 (Son of Robert Johnson & 1st wife)

James W. CARR b. 1849 - d. 1850 - buried with Stanmore & Mary - Age 1 yr.
Thomas Iverson CARR - b. 1851 - m. Lutitia Callaway & Emma Ethridge
Frank C. CARR b. 30 Jan. 1855 - m. Rebecca Pennington & Maude Wiggins

Mariah CARR born in S.C. about 1813 apparently came to Wilkinson Co., GA with Stanmore (S.B.) CARR and Samuel CARR and first record is her marriage to John Gabriel Jones on 17 Sept. 1846. Mariah was the 2nd wife of John Gabriel Jones and 20 years his junior.
