 in Am. Rev.;

 America to Peter Sprigman (1766-1821), from
 Germany, 1775, soldier Am. Rev., settled at
 Lebanon, Pa., m a French woman;
 3-Peter Augustus (1786-1864), a founder city of
 Springfield, O., m 3d, 1831, Martha Elizabeth
 Scott Cooper (1802-85), dau. James Cowper, 1754-
 1833, Dayton, O. (son of Col. Cowper, Scotland),
 m 1780, Rachel Wilkins Powers.
