Dear Rochelle:

I have just completed the 10 hours of research on Jenkins, with some on McGarrah.

I located a book called "Jenkins Family of Virginia and North Carolina by Mettie Jenkins Bowen, and am sending you photocopies therefrom. This takes you back to Virginia in 1600's.

Since I first found this book, I set about trying to prove whether your Samuel W. Jenkins was a son of James Jenkins whose LWT in Granville Co., N. C. Named wife, Patty Crask, and sons, Elias, Joshua, Joseph, John, James, Wilson and Samuel. It does appear that several of his sons moved to Columbia and Elbert Co. regions.

I found where Samuel Jenkins drew in the 1820 Georgia Land Lottery, a resident of Elbert Co., Gaines District, drew land in Early Co., Land Lot 49, Section 15. This is a south-Georgia county and he doesn't seem to have every taken up that land. I searched Columbia Co. Where Samuel Jenkins was a Pvt. in the 10th Co. in 1793.

Samuel W. Jenkins must have had sons, James and Joseph, who were listed on 1850 Elbert Co., Ga. Census as follows

Here is what I learned about the family of James Jenkins, d. Granville Co., N. C.

1. Elias Jenkins listed on 1830 Granville Co., N. C. Census.
2. Joshua Jenkins removed to Elbert Co., Ga. where he was a Sheriff in 1811.
Joshua m. Milly Ellet 4/19/1810 Elbert Co.
3. Joseph Jenkins lived in Elbert Co., Ga., having a son, James, b. 1811, d. Madison Co. m. 1st, 1/26/1832 Felicia Warren and 2nd, 10/28/1860 Marium Harriet Brown. The LWT of James Jenkins in madison Co., Will Book B, page 378-380, says "being somewhat advanced in years," leaves wife, Harriet the homeplace and 169 acres on waters of Double Branches for support of her three minor children, Adam V., James M. and Thelitia W. Mentioned 6 children which he had by his first wife, viz: Elias P., Elizabeth Davis, Susan Cunningham, Mary Ann Barden, Jane Will and

Cornelius Owen. Exrs: Elias P. And Adam V. Jenkins.

4. John Jenkins.

5. James Jenkins, removed to Columbia Co., Ga. After he appeared on 1784 Granville Co., Nc and 1790 Tax Digest. He apparently married Winnifred Thorn. He must have died after 1798 in Columbia Co.

4/7/1798 Columbia Co. Deed - James Jenkins of Richmond Co. to Seaborn Jones, attorney, of Richmond Co., "owing Jones 210, 2100 ft. of good sound merchantable lumber or board, payable in four annual installments at William Turnbull's near Saannah, indebted to the sum of \$670 in three notes of hand. Jenkins petitions to sell 350 acres on the "Western Road" near Bedford, already given as security for above loan to Jones. He also mortgages 100 acres adj. Thomas Moore on Little Kiokee Creek; negro slaves -- Will, Herod, Isaac, Valentine, Essa, Paty, Dinah, Faith, Chloe, Jinny, Daphne, Lucy and Letty. Also horse, wagon, team, 40 head of cattle marked with a crop in the left ear and an under keel in the right.

12/15/1795 Daniel Loflin and wife, Anna, to James Jenkins for \$228.57, 116 2/3 acres on both sides of Little Kiokee Creek, bounded southwest by widow Coleman (formerly Roseborough), northwest by William Osborn, northeast by Thomas Moore, part of a tract granted to George Roseborough, deceased.

The widow of Capt. James Jenkins, Winnifred Jenkins made a LWT in Columbia Co., nun-cupative on 1/1/1807. Deponents were Martha Collins and Willy Collins who were called to attend her dying condition, then after a short recovery of several days, she asked that her belongings be disposed of. One barren cow to James Reed's wife. Elizabeth D'Antignac, the works and felling to make a riding habit. To Margaret McGill, one new black bonnet. To martha Collins, one old black bonnet and wear it for the sake of the deceased. To Joshua and Hightower Thorn, house furniture. To children of Priestly Thorn, \$50 to be used to educate the children under the discretion of her brother Hightower.

LWT of Thomas McGarrah 4/23/1887:8/1/1887 named children: James, Martha Croxton, Rachel Carter, Mittie, Writhey Harvey and son-in-law, Moses McGarrah.

LWT of Moses McGarrah 11/9/1889:1/6/1890 named wife, M. P. and children: George T., Samuel, Eula (minor), Mary, Burta. Also, sister, Mary E.

Sumter Co. Wills

LWT of James McGarrah probated 7/8/1886 named wife, Mary, deceased daughter, Mary M. Harper. Grandson, James W. Harper and son, Samuel McGarrah.

LWT of Jonathan Ross probatd 5/21/881 named his daughter, Edna J., the wife of Samuel McGarrah.

Conclusions:

I can probably locate more information on the descendants of Joseph, James and Wilson Jenkins (sons of James Jenkins of Granville Co., N. C) in Georgia. This would round out the genealogy more, although this research will not find any further references to Samuel. I believe that Elbert Co. records are incomplete. I did search Wilkes Co., but found nothing concrete there for Samuel. Capt. James Jenkins descendants might be the ones in Madison Co. Look this over, and see where you want to go. I am trying to locate an old Elbert Co. Map, to look for the homeplace of Samuel Jenkins.
