Here is a story that was told to Rita Parsons Cantrell by her Father, about Samuel Ray Parsons. Samuel Ray married a woman and then went to war. While he was at war his wife took his big horse and sold it to a man named Tom Kirk for food to feed herself and her children. Before Samuel came home she tried to buy the horse back (she had written Samuel, told him what happened and how much she had gotten for the horse - he sent her the money to buy it back), but Tom did not want to give it back. When Samuel got home and found out what happened he went to get the horse back. Tom still would not give the horse back so Samuel shot and killed him. Samuel then left for seven years. When he came home his wife had married someone else, so he stayed with them for a couple of days and then moved on and eventually met and married Rose Mary Stroud.

Wile in the war Samuel lost an arm.

Janell Parsons says her father recalls hearing people talk about Samuel Ray being a very brave man. A story her father heard - for many nights people heard cries from a graveyard. One night Samuel went out to see what it was. He found a white figure laying across a grave. It was a woman who had been sleep walking. He picked her up and took her home. Through Samuel the mystery was solved. Samuel Ray's horse was named Stone Wall.

DEATH PREVENTS CELEBRATION OF 74TH ANNIVERSARY OF PARSONS WEDDING

Way back in 1859, on November 20, a couple was married down in Georgia, and in 1887 they moved to Arkansas and settled at Athens, where they lived happily until Sunday night, October 22, when the husband died, breaking a marital tie which had held for almost 74 years. The old people are well and favorably known throughout this section, being Mr. and Mrs. C. P. Parsons, who took an active part in the early development of the north end of the county. Mr. Parsons' death prevented the couple celebrating their 74th wedding anniversary, preparations for which had been started by their children and friends. Mr. Parsons was 89 years old on September 4, and Mrs. Parsons was 90 years old on October 21.

Fourteen children were born to the couple, twelve of whom are living as follows: Mrs. Mary Jane Adair, Hiram, GA; Mrs. Julia Hollis, Vandervort, ARK; R. L. Parsons, Athens; Geo. Radford was a farmer. Minnie did the housework and tended to the children in addition to working in the fields with Radford. They always had a cotton field and large vegetable gardens. You never saw a blade of grass or weed in their fields. They worked them everyday. They would get up at dawn and while Minnie was cooking breakfast, Radford would milk, and do other chores. Radford, always was a very slender man, had a philosophy about eating. He said, "Eat like a king at breakfast, a prince at lunch and a pauper at supper." He had a large coffee cup that sat in a saucer. He would pour his coffee in the saucer to cool, then drink it from the saucer. Sometimes he would make a "Soakie". He would place a biscuitsuit in the saucer, pour coffee over it, let the biscuit soak it up, then he would take a spoon and eat it. His favorite supper was cornbread and milk, with a slice of onion.

They loved young people. When the children got older, Radford and Minnie would clear out the front two rooms of their house once a month and have a square dance for the young people in their community. Radford played the fiddle and/or harmonica. Minnie played the mandolin, the harmonica, or the juice harp. Louvie played the piano and Aubrey played the guitar. Hollis loved to buck dance and Lawrence just loved to have fun.

When Louvie was 12 years old, Radford bought a brand new 1919 Dork (a car). He told her that he wanted her to learn to drive. She was the only girl in the community who could drive. When the first airplane came to Paulding County, Radford let Louvie take a ride in it - it cost \$10. When She was six years old, Radford bought her a piano. He drove her to Hiram every Saturday (in a wagon) for lessons. When that teacher moved away he drove her to Dallas for lessons. She played beautifully and at a young age was playing the piano or pump organ at several churches. Churches back then had meeting once a month, so she played at three or four different churches.

Radford and Minnie took a lot of pride in their work. Minnie was a very hard worker and could easily pick 400 pounds of cotton a day. One morning she got up and told Radford that she was going to

pick a bale of cotton that day. She always picked two rows at once. She got out, picked all day just as hard as she could. She just knew that she had picked a bale - she almost did, she was only about five pounds shy of a bale.

Minnie always had the most beautiful flower gardens in the community. When they lived close to the main highway, people would stop and ask to look at the gardens. People would take pictures of her flowers. If you came to visit you never left empty handed. She would give you a jar of jelly or jam, a handmade apron made from flour sacks, a bouquet of flowers, or fresh vegetables or fruits.

Radford sold fruit trees. He could graft fruit trees too. They always had apple, pear, plum, peach, fig, and cherry trees. Everywhere they lived Radford planted many fruit trees. They always picked wild blackberries, strawberries and persimmons too.

They were always working, doing extra things to make a little money. Minnie made butter and buttermilk and sold the extra. She had plenty of eggs to sell. Radford took care of selling the crops, sold extra vegetables, sold and planted fruit trees, gave haircuts, and even did potrait photography for a time.

Minnie was a wonderful seamstress and was always making their clothes, making aprons, piecing quilt tops and quilting them. She could crochet, embroidery and make tatting. At night Radford would sit and read the Bible out loud. Minnie would do needle work while he read. She taught Louvie to do all of these thing and in turn Louvie taught her daughters to sew.

In the summertime, after lunch, when it was too hot to work in the fields, Radford and Minnie would load up their fishing gear in their little gray car and go down to George creek below their house and fish in the shade of the creek bank. They did everything together, now matter whether it was working or playing. In the warmer of her woodburning cookstove, Minnie always had a platter of tea cakes or biscuits made for the grandchildren when they came. When any of the grandchildren would spend the night, Radford always told them before he went to bed, "The first one to go to sleep give a whistle".

Minnie and Radford were well liked and respected in their community. Radford was good at nursing sick people and he was always there when needed. I wrote this story to help preserve some of the memories of them for their future generations. Dale

Notes for RADFORD FULTON SINYARD:

Radford was a farmer. Minnie did the housework and tended to the children in addition to working in the fields with Radford. They always had a cotton field and large vegetable gardens. You never saw a blade of grass or weed in their fields. They worked them everyday. They would get up at dawn and while Minnie was cooking breakfast, Radford would milk, and do other chores. Radford, always was a very slender man, had a philosophy about eating. He said, "Eat like a king at breakfast, a prince at lunch and a pauper at supper." He had a large coffee cup that sat in a saucer. He would pour his coffee in the saucer to cool, then drink it from the saucer. Sometimes he would make a "Soakie". He would place a biscuit in the saucer, pour coffee over it, let the biscuit soak it up, then he would take a spoon and eat it. His favorite supper was cornbread and milk, with a slice of onion.

They loved young people. When the children got older, Radford and Minnie would clear out the front two rooms of their house once a month and have a square dance for the young people in their community. Radford played the fiddle and/or harmonica. Minnie played the mandolin, the harmonica, or the juice harp. Louvie played the piano and Aubrey played the guitar. Hollis loved to buck dance and Lawrence just loved to have fun.

When Louvie was 12 years old, Radford bought a brand new 1919 Dork (a car). He told her that he wanted her to learn to drive. She was the only girl in the community who could drive. When the first airplane came to Paulding County, Radford let Louvie take a ride in it - it cost \$10. When She was six years old, Radford bought her a piano. He drove her to Hiram every Saturday (in a wagon) for lessons. When that teacher moved away he drove her to Dallas for lessons. She played beautifully and at a young age was playing the piano or pump organ at several churches. Churches back then had meeting once a month, so she played at three or four different churches.

Radford and Minnie took a lot of pride in their work. Minnie was a very hard worker and could easily pick 400 pounds of cotton a day. One morning she got up and told Radford that she was going to pick a bale of cotton that day. She always picked two rows at once. She got out, picked all day just as hard as she could. She just knew that she had picked a bale - she almost did, she was only about five pounds shy of a bale.

Minnie always had the most beautiful flower gardens in the community. When they lived close to the main highway, people would stop and ask to look at the gardens. People would take pictures of her flowers. If you came to visit you never left empty handed. She would give you a jar of jelly or jam, a handmade apron made from flour sacks, a bouquet of flowers, or fresh vegetables or fruits.

Radford sold fruit trees. He could graft fruit trees too. They always had apple, pear, plum, peach, fig, and cherry trees. Everywhere they lived Radford planted many fruit trees. They always picked wild blackberries, strawberries and persimmons too.

They were always working, doing extra things to make a little money. Minnie made butter and buttermilk and sold the extra. She had plenty of eggs to sell. Radford took care of selling the crops, sold extra vegetables, sold and planted fruit trees, gave haircuts, and even did potrait photography for a

time.

Minnie was a wonderful seamstress and was always making their clothes, making aprons, piecing quilt tops and quilting them. She could crochet, embroidery and make tatting. At night Radford would sit and read the Bible out loud. Minnie would do needle work while he read. She taught Louvie to do all of these thing and in turn Louvie taught her daughters to sew.

In the summertime, after lunch, when it was too hot to work in the fields, Radford and Minnie would load up their fishing gear in their little gray car and go down to George creek below their house and fish in the shade of the creek bank. They did everything together, now matter whether it was working or playing. In the warmer of her woodburning cookstove, Minnie always had a platter of tea cakes or buscuits made for the grandchildren when they came. When any of the grandchildren would spend the night, Radford always told them before he went to bed, "The first one to go to sleep give a whistle".

Minnie and Radford were well liked and respected in their community. Radford was good at nursing sick people and he was always there when needed. I wrote this story to help preserve some of the memories of them for their future generations. Dale

JAMES R. PARSONS WAS SHOT ACCIDENTALLY IN AFFAIR
THAT TOOK LIFE OF R. M. DOUGLAS - DAVIS HELD

Two men are dead as the result of a shooting affray at Cove Saturday afternoon, and Ras Davis, is held a prisoner at the Polk county jail to answer to the law for the double killing. The dead men are James Radford Parsons, who was shot unintentionally, and R. M. Douglas a fellow farmer of Davis in the Cove Community.

Parsons was found dead in the Goff Drug store at Cove, following the shooting, and Douglas, at first thought to be only slightly wounded, died Sunday morning about 4 o'clock in the hospital at De Queen. As a result of the double tragedy L. Parker, deputy prosecuting attorney, filed information Sunday morning in Justice J. H. Bratcher's court, against Davis, charging him with murder in the first degree, for the killing of Douglas, and involuntary manslaughter for the death of Parsons.

The preliminary hearing of Davis is set for 10 a. m., Tuesday morning, when Justice Bratcher will hold court at the courthouse.
