Item 2<sup>nd</sup>

I give the property which I shall own at my decease  
which consists at this time in Money and Notes to be equally  
divided between my daughters Julia Watson & Elizabeth Holley  
Margaret Stamps deceased four Children to have one share  
Jane Black, Mary A McCray & F L Roberts said property to belong  
to the children above named and their bodily heirs.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup>

Myself having given to my son James M Roberts and  
my daughter Cynthia A McCray heretofore their full share

Item 4<sup>th</sup>

I give my household and kitchen furniture consisting  
of Cooking utensils Beds and Bedding and Wearing Apparel  
to Julia Watson Mary A McCray & F L Roberts & wife.

Item 5<sup>th</sup>

I desire and appoint my son F L Roberts Executor of  
this my last Will and Testament.

Last Will and Testament of Ole Benson Deceased  
State of Georgia, Carroll County.

In the name of God Amen I Ole Benson of said  
State and County, being of advanced age, but of sound  
and disposing memory knowing that I must shortly depart  
this life, deem it right and proper, both as respects my family  
and myself that I should make a disposition of the property  
with which a kind Providence has blessed me. I do there  
fore make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking  
and annulling all others by me heretofore made.

First I desire and direct that my body be buried in a  
decent and Christianlike manner suitable to my circumstances  
and condition in life. My soul I trust shall return to rest  
with the God who gave it as I hope for salvation through the  
mercy and atonement of our blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus  
Christ.

Secondly I desire and direct that all my just debts

be paid with as little delay as possible, by my Executors hereinafter named and appointed  
Thirdly I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved daughter, Georgia Ann McGee wife of Henry McGee of the State of Mississippi, the sum of Five hundred dollars as soon as the same can be collected and Five hundred dollars each year thereafter until she shall receive the sum of Two thousand dollars out of my estate.

Fourthly, I will and bequeath to my Son Newton Levi Benson the sum of Five hundred dollar as soon as the same can be collected.

Fifthly: To my beloved wife Sarah Jane Benson I give and bequeath all the property belonging to my estate less the bequest heretofore made to my daughter Georgia Ann McGee and Newton Levi for her support during her life and at her death all the estate shall be sold and equally divided among my Children to wit: Sarah Alberta Bass, wife of B. F. Bass, John William, Newton Levi, and James P Benson.

Sixthly, I hereby constitute, and appoint my son Newton Levi Benson Executor of this my last Will and Testament, to take the entire charge of my estate, that collecting and paying my just debts, to loan at interest all money that my wife may be supported upon the same.
