I John Murdock of said State and County being of advanced age and knowing that I must shortly depart from this world deem it right and proper both as respects myself and family that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me & therefore make this my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all others heretofore made by me.

Item fourth I give and devise unto my beloved daughters Sarah A. Murdock and Mary Murdock the remaining part of my estate both real and personal consisting of seventy acres of land more or less it being a part of lot of land number two hundred and fifty five (255) lying in the fifth district & fourth section of Chattooga County with all the right, moor and appurtenances to said parcel of land belonging or in any manner appertaining also cattle hogs sheep fowls plantation tools and all other householding & other thing House hold and kitchen furniture and every thing else that I now possess.

Item fifth I desire and direct that all the above mentioned property be equally divided share and share alike between my two daughters named in the foregoing item or their legal representatives.

Item sixth I constitute and appoint my worthy friends and neighbors Charles H. Pratt and Joseph A. Pratt Executors of this my last will and Testament this September 15 1865.
