and William Dickinson, ordered that the same
be admitted to Record.

Georgia } As the name of God amen,
Decatur County } I Jeremiah Slade of the above named place
being of sound and disposing mind and memory and knowing the
uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do make this my last
will and Testament in manner and form following.

First of all I commend my soul to Almighty God who gave it
and my body to be decently buried.

Item first. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah
for and during her life time or widowhood that part of the
lot of land whereon I now live, described as follows: beginning at
the South West Corner of said lot and running due north
across the Creek to a certain Blazed pine, being the first four
-foot tree after crossing the Creek & from thence to our due
East to the East line of said lot of land and thence to
follow the original lines to the said South West Corner or
place first named & forty acres of land adjoining said

in the Twentysecond district of originally Early now
Deatur County, also two negroes Ellick & Jimmy & one
furnished furniture and all my household kitchen

Item third. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah
to be subject to her own disposals three Cows & year-
lings. Three ewes & lambs. Three sows & pigs one feather bed
and furniture and one mattrap. one eight day Clock, all
my provisions now on hand including my meat hog and
my carriage and one Brown horse called black.

Item fourth. It is my will and desire that all the balance of
my estate both real and personal not herein before spe-
cified be divided into three lots as nearly equal as
may be practicable and drawn for by my three
daughters, Badeaux Mills, Polly Fitzgerald & Petsy Ann
Robinson. and I will here make mention that
I have long since given to my three daughters above named
the negroes which they have severally had from me and the
boy Bristow now with me was at the same time given to
my daughter Polly Fitzgerald

Item fifth. It is my will & desire that at my wifes death or
intermarriage with another man that the two negroes named to her
Ellick & Jimmy shall go to and belong to my daughter Petsy Ann
Robinson for the reason that she has been unfortunate with the
negroes given her heretofore, and that all the other property
given to her for and during her lifetime or widowhood be at her
death or marriage equally divided between my said three daughters

Item sixth. It is my wish that my herein after named Executors
proceed to collect what and all the debts that are due
me and after paying all my funeral & burying expenses. if any
there be and Doctors Bices, that they divide the balance equally
between my said three daughters

Item seventh.

I hereby constitute and appoint Daniel B

executors and executor to this my last will & testament
