from giving bond and security, making any
appraisement or making any return to the
Court of Ordinary.

Item III. It is my desire that my said wife shall
have the right to sell any part of my
property willed to her and to execute titles
to the same, if she considers it to her in-
terest to do so, without obtaining any order
for the same.
