In the name of God Amen,

I John Allen of the County and State aforesaid, being weak in body, and disporing memory, and fearing the approachings of mortatly fast advancing on my Constitution, & believing ere long I shall have to appear before him to whom I am in debt for my existence, as well as all other blessings which I do enjoy, do make and publish this my last will & Testament as follows to wit - First of all I recommend my soul to God who gave it, and my Body to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my surviving Friends, And as to the estate wherewith wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I dispose of the same in the following Manner (to wit)

Item. 1st The Land wherow I now live, I leave to my Belovd wife Mary Allen, also all the House-hold and Kitchen furniture, and plantation tools, the Cart & Horses, two Horse Beasts, and half of all the Stock of cattle & hogs and Slap, also one negro man by the name of Mordecai, and one negro man by the name of Winston, and one negro woman named Aggy, also one negro woman named Rachel, also one negro woman named Ginda, & three small Children by the names of Scipio, Betty & Susan, to one boy named Mordecai Manchester, also one negro Child named Stancy, & see the above property with its inclosure, except what is here after in this will disposed of, together, with any part of my estate that may not be disposed of in this will, to be sold

after the death of my beloved wife Mary Allen
and the money arising from the sale thereof
to be equally divided between all my children
except the half of two lots of land which my
son James Allen is now empowered to sell
which my executors is authorized to sell when
they may think proper, the money to be
divided as above

Item 2. I give unto my son Richard Allen one negro
girl by the name of Mary, also five hundred
dollars, three hundred of which the said Richard
Allen has already received, in money and
property -

Item 3. I give unto my son Asa Allen one negro man
named Moses which he now has in possession
& other property which is his full part -

Item 4. I give unto my son John Allen Jr. one negro
man named Charles, also money & other
property which the said John Allen has reci-
-ived to the amount of four hundred & eighty
six dollars -

Item 5. I give unto my son James Allen a tract
of land wherein he now lives, also money &
property to the amount of two hundred dollars
which the said James has received, also one
negro boy named Tom, also the one half
of two tracts of Land which he is now
empowered to sell -

Item 6. I give unto my son Washington Allen one
negro man named Randal which he
now has in possession, also money and
property to the amount of three hundred
and thirty four dollars, which said
Washington has received already -

Item 7. I give unto my daughter Elizabeth Kelly
six hundred dollars in cash, which she

I have received some years ago, which I consider
her full part.

- Item 8. I give unto my daughter Mary Lane one negro
woman named Fanny & her children, which
the said Mary has already received
- Item 9. I give unto my three grand children, heirs
of my daughter deceased Sarah Christian
one hundred dollars, which they are
to receive at the death of my beloved wife
Mary Allen, out of the proceeds of the prop-
erty given to her during her life time -
- Item 10. I give unto my daughter Nancy Carroll
the sum of Five dollars
- Item 11. I give unto my Grand Daughter Sally Mayfield
one negro girl named Martha, I also
give unto Grand Daughter Virginia
one negro girl named Harriett
and Anthony her child
- Item 12. I give unto my Grand Son John Allen, son
of Washington Allen one negro boy named
Mordecai Wm. Chester, which he is to receive
at the death of my beloved wife Mary Allen
- Item 13. I give unto my daughter Matilda Holley
one negro woman named Hafney which she has
now in possession, also one negro woman named
Rachel, and her child named Nancy, and
her increase which she is to have at the death
of my beloved wife Mary Allen
- And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son
Richard Allen, & James Allen & my son in Law
Pleasant Holley my sole Executors to execute this my
last Will & testament. I do hereby revoke all former
wills by me made, in witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this the eighth
of December 1831 -

GEORGIA January the twenty eighth, Eighteen
hundred and thirty two
in the name of God Amen

I, John Clark Rose being old and infirm and weak
of body, but of perfect mind and memory, calling
to mind the mortality of the Body, and knowing that
it is appointed for all men once to die miserable &
or dear than my last will and Testament, that is to say,
principally and first of all I give & recommend my
soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it
and my body I recommend to the Earth to be
buried in decent order at the discretion of my
friends, nothing doubting but at the general resurrec-
tion, I shall receive the same by the mighty power of
God, and as touching such worldly estate whatsoever
it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give
and dispose of the same in the following manner
and form - First I give to and bequeath to my
beloved Daughter Polly Boswell Two Dollars
