 time sickly and weak in body, but in perfect
 mind and memory, thank be given unto God

Calling into mind the mortality of my body, and
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die,
do make and ordain this my last will and Testament.
that is to say principally and first of all I give and
recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that
gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth, to
be buried in decent Christian burial at the direction
of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the general
Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the
mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly
estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me
in this life, I give demise and dispose of the same
in the following manner and form —
First I give and bequeath unto my son William
one negro boy called Sambo. to him his heirs and
assigns forever — Secondly I give and bequeath
to my son John one negro woman called Rachel
to him his heirs and assigns forever
Thirdly I give and bequeath to my son Robert one negro
woman called Sam, to him his heirs and assigns forever —
Fourthly I give and bequeath to my son Elijah one negro
girl called Sam to him his heirs and assigns forever
Fifthly I give and bequeath to my son Peter one negro
girl called Rose, to him his heirs and assigns forever —
Sixthly I give and bequeath to my son Samuel one negro
boy called Isaac to him his heirs and assigns forever —
And I also give and bequeath unto my son Samuel a
part of the tract of land wherupon I now live, begin-
ning at the mouth of big Shoal Creek thence up the
said Creek to the wagon Road, from thence up
the ridge between the River Jugule and the said Creek
to the back line, thence with that line to the river —
to the beginning including two hundred acres more or
less to him and his heirs forever —
Seventhly, I give and bequeath unto my son Moses two
hundred acres of land, being also part of the
tract wherupon I now live, including the

64 and mill, together with all dwellings and
improvements thereon to him and his heirs for-
ever. And I also give and bequeath to my
son Moses one negro girl named Lett, to
him and his heirs forever, Eightieth, I give and
bequeath to my four daughters namely: Betsy
Suzannah, Hannah, and Mary one negro
fellow named Kato to be sold and the money
to be equally divided amongst them by my
Executors - The rest of my property after
my ^{lawful} debts and paid to be equally divided
amongst all my children, sons and
daughters at the discretion of my Executors.
And lastly I constitute and make and ordain
my son John and my son Robert the sole
Executors of this my last will and Testament -
and I do utterly disallow revoke & disannul
all and every other former Testaments wills
and Executors by me in any wise before na-
med, ratifying and confirming this and no
other to be my last will and Testament -
In witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this second day of Novr.
in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and ninety three -
