 I Jeremiah Lindsey of the County & State aforesaid being
 of sound mind & memory in a low state of health but of sound mind & memory
 making this my last will & testament. The first of all I give my soul to God who gave
 it to me & my body I bequeath to its mother & it is a decent christian burial
 Then the 1st I give to my wife Sally the land & premises whereon I now live during
 her natural life & at her death I give the said land to my grandson
 Jeremiah I Shapton. Also I give to my wife Sally one negro boy not two but should
 have been during her natural life & at her death to be equally divided among my children
 With 2nd my will further is that the whole of my personal estate (to wit) my stock of every
 kind my plantation tools my household & kitchen furniture (except the beds & bed
 furniture, negro boy and named above) my crop of every description & every other
 article that composes my estate to be sold. After my just debts being first
 paid to be equally divided among my legacies. I appoint my wife Sally
 my friends Samuel Green & John Meser my executors to this last
 will & testament this the 15th day of March 1823.
