County being produced in Court and the due and legal execu-
tion thereof and of the codicil thereto annexed being proved by
the oath of Tuttle H. Andrus one of the subscribing Witnesses thereto,
and the sanity of the testator at the time of the execution thereof
being proved by said witness to the satisfaction of the Court—
It is ordered that said last Will and testament & Codicil be held and
considered as duly proved— and that it be admitted to record.

Mary Lucas, ~~Elizabeth~~ Stovall and Nathan C. Sayre nominated
Executrix and Executors of the last Will and testament of John
Lucas late of Sparta dec^d appeared personally in Court and were
duly qualified as executrix and executors of said last Will &
Testament. Whereupon it is ordered that letters Testamentary
do issue to them accordingly.

On the application of the executrix and executors of the last
Will and Testament of John Lucas late of Sparta dec^d. It is orde-
ed that William Terrell, William Inley, Robert S. Sayre, Wil-
son Bird, William H. Sayre, Joseph Bryan Senr, Wiley Allen,
Barnaby Shivers, Thomas Dudley, Philip Turner and George
J. Marshall be appointed appraisers of the personal property
of said dec^d— and that they or any three or more of them do
appraise said personal property— being first duly sworn according
to Law— and that they return their appraisement thereof to said
Ex^x & Ex^{ors} within the time prescribed by Law.

In the name of the everliving God— Amen—
I John Lucas of Sparta, being at this time of sound and disposing
mind and memory, and desirous of making such disposition of my
property as the situation and exigencies of my family require from
me, do make and ordain the following as my last Will and testament.
First

First I give unto my beloved wife Mary Lucas during her natural life the following property, to wit, my tract of Land and plantation on Shoulders Creek (except such part as I may hereafter convey to others) with all the Horses, mules, stock of all kinds, plantation utensils thereon, and as much of my household and kitchen furniture, bedding &c. as she may deem convenient and suitable for her; also the following negroes, to wit, African Jack, Bob, Mat, Sam, Daniel, Tom, John, Cyrus, Stafford, Mahala, Lucy, Jane the seamstress, old Sinny, Betty the weaver, & her two children Pulaski and an infant, small girl called Patsey, old London and Judge Bob, with ^{the} use of the increase of said female slaves during her life - also I give to my wife absolutely to her own use the carriage and horses used therewith at my decease and the crops of all kinds that may be growing on said plantation at the time of my decease, and a sufficiency of Bacon, provisions, corn &c. to support her and said negroes & stock for the current year - and in the event that my said wife shall prefer to reside on any part of my lands or estates, other than our present residence, I direct and authorize the executors hereof herein after named, and such of them as shall qualify and the survivor, out of the proceeds of any property that may be sold by them to build her a comfortable dwelling house, with convenient and suitable outhouses, wherever on my land she may designate, as soon as conveniently may be done for her use and benefit during life, and until such dwelling shall be completed, that she have the use and possession of our present residence with the outhouses and appurtenances.

Secondly I give and bequeath unto my son William Henry Lucas the following negroes, to wit, Cosce and his wife Mitty Ann and their children Margarit and Andy, Bishop, Pleasant, Madison, Harriett and her child with such increase as may hereafter be born of said female slaves - also my Silver Watch and silver topped gun which are to be delivered to him when he shall be of sufficient discretion in the opinion of my wife to take care of them - also on the decease of my wife the seamstress Jane and her increase if any - and also on the expiration of two years from my decease I give to him my fifty shares of Capital Stock of the Bank of this State, at this time in the hands of Pleasant Stovall.

I confirm unto my grand daughter Frances S. Davies the gift
of the Negro girl Fanny and her increase, now in her possession.

Fourthly

I direct and it is my Will and desire that the negroes given to
my son William Henry remain in the possession of my Wife for
the purpose of maintaining and educating him - and after the
expiration of two years from my decease, that my executors do
pay to her for the same purpose the dividends that may accrue
on said Bank Stock - and when my son shall attain lawful
age or shall marry, that he have the possession and control of the
property herein before & herein after bequeathed and devised to him - and
during the said two years, that the dividends on said stock be applied by
my executors in the payment of my debts, if any, or to form part of my
estate herein after disposed of.

Fifthly

I order and direct that my Ogeechee plantation, my Sparta pla-
ntation, together with all my lands on the West of the Ocmulgee river
(excepting one hundred acres of said plantation or lands if my Wife shall
make her election to reside thereon, and which hundred acres I give
and devise to her during her life) with all the Stock plantation also
situate on said Ogeechee plantation and all other personal property
as I may be possessed of, except Negroes, and such personal property
as I have herein before given to my Wife and Son, be sold as soon
after my decease as conveniently may be done - the land upon
a credit of from one to five years, in annual payments, well sec-
ured, and the personal property on the usual credit - the proceeds
whereof to be applied as herein before & hereafter directed, and to the
payment of my debts if any - and to this end I authorize the exe-
cutors hereof and such as shall qualify, and the survivor to lay off and
divide said plantations and lands into such parcels and allotments
as they or the survivor may deem advantageous and for the benefit
of my estate generally - and on the decease of my said Wife I
direct that the Shouidubone plantation, and all the personal prop-
erty thereon (excepting that which she may acquire) and also the
one hundred acres of land that may be set apart for my Wife, if
she shall elect to reside thereon as herein before mentioned, be
sold by said Executors and the survivor, on the same terms, and
in the same manner, and for the same purposes as herein before
expressed in relation to the sale of the other property -

and I do authorize and empower the executors hereof hereinafter men-
ed, and such of them as shall qualify to this my will, and the survi-
vor of them, and his or her executors, to sell and dispose of said lands
plantations and property in manner aforesaid, and good and perfect
titles to the same to make to the purchasers thereof, as fully as if the
same were conveyed to said executors to sell.

Sixthly - I order and direct that as soon after the sale first contin-
-plated and directed, of said lands plantations and personalties
as may be practicable and convenient - the negroes not herein
specifically disposed of, and their increase, together with the bonds
notes and monies arising from said sales be by the executors here-
of divided into eight equal parts or portions - to be distributed and
disposed of as follows -

one moiety whereof I give and bequeath to the children of my dau-

to the executors hereof hereinafter named, and to such of them as
shall qualify, and to the survivor, to be held in trust for the
use and benefit of my said daughter Eliza H. Lucas, free
separate and distinct from her husband, and so that his
claims and rights shall not attach thereon - and on the
decease of my said daughter, I give and bequeath said por-
tion to the children of herself and her present and my future
husband, - and if she have no such children, then to her child-
ren by her first husband herein before named.

And one part and portion thereof being set apart in negroes, I give and bequeath to said executors and to such of them as shall qualify and to the survivor in trust for the use and benefit of my daughter Caroline Lee Shelman, free separate and distinct from her husband and so that his claims and rights shall not attach thereon, and that she may have a source of maintenance and support during life - and on her decease I give and bequeath said portion and the increase or issue of said negroes to her children to be equally divided between them.

and to this end I direct that after said sales, and after the payment of my debts and the necessary expenses and charges, a division of said negroes, and of the proceeds of such sales be so made in relation to the value of the aforesaid several portions, that the parts and portions, herein before & hereafter set apart and bequeathed for the benefit of my said daughters, Eliza, Martha, and Caroline, respectively, shall be exclusively in negro property if practicable and for the purpose of making said division, I authorize and direct the executors hereof to procure the aid of some two or three of my friends therein. And in the event that my son William or either of my said daughters shall die without leaving a child or children at his or her death I give and direct the portion property and estate herein before given to him or her shall pass to the executors hereof and be disposed of as herein expressed in said sixth item, amongst the survivors, and subject to the same limitation, and trust, as therein expressed.

Seventhly On the sale of the Shoulterbone plantation after the decease of my wife and on the sale of the personally thereon, as herein before directed, I order and direct that the negroes herein before given

to hold, except such as may have been herein specifically disposed of, and the proceeds of such sales, be divided set apart and distributed in the same manner and to the persons, and subject to the same trusts and contingencies as expressed and directed in the aforesaid sixth item.

Eightly I do hereby revoke and annul all and every former and other Will and testament by me heretofore made - declaring this to be my only last Will and testament.

Lastly I do nominate constitute and appoint my Wife Mary Lucas Executrix and my friends Pleasant Stovall of Augusta and Nathan C. Sayre of Hancock Executors of this my Will and trustees as before expressed with all the powers to executors given by Law and by me herein before delegated.

In testimony whereof I have hereto set my hand and seal this twenty fourth day of January 1829.
