Proclamation of Jasper County

In the of god amen I James Patrick of the
State of Georgia and County of Jasper being
in a low state of health ^{body} but of sound mind
and memory do make and ordain this my
last will and testament in manner and
form following to wit. First I will and
bequeath unto my daughter Jane Percheskin
and assigns one cow and half twenty five
Bushels of Corn. Secondly I will and
bequeath unto my son Robert Patrick
his heirs and assigns the following parcel
of Land ~~beg~~ beginning at a corner to be
found on Church Lands line on road on the
west side of the bridge on murder Creek and
thence running a direct line to a hickory corner
made by one son some time past as a dividing
corner thence up the meanders of the ~~river~~
branch of ~~the river~~ ^{once made by the river}
called Phillips, thence by a straight line to
a post oak stake corner on the old line to
a stake corner adjoining thick lands and
Whittingtons and thence on Church Lands
line to the beginning corner. I bequeath to
my son Robert Patrick the mill with its
stones and Sows and anything that now
belongs to said mill together with four
hundred feet of Plantation ~~land~~
of my dwelling house ~~being~~ forty five bushels
