due attention to me during my long illness forty
acres of the lot whereon I now live beginning at
Jeffers & Bankers & my corner running from my house
to Jeffers thence with said road to my spring path
thence on with said path to Bankers thence to the be-
-gining containing forty acres more or less. My will & desire
is after my death said old negroes make choice of a
guardian who will take the control of them & their
business so long as they live. I also give to said
old negroes my bay & also saddle an Cow & calf and
some pigs with some & also bed & kitchen furniture
furnishing utensils & provisions sufficient to support
them one year & also my bed clothing also to be appointed
-one of to them by my Ex^{rs} hereafter named. My will
& desire is after the death of the old man & woman afo-
-resaid the land together with the stock & all the articles
herein given them or the remains of them may revert
to & become a part of my estate to be sold by my Ex^{rs} &
the proceeds advanced to my sister Sally Lin

2nd I give to Samuel Edwards my negro man Charley

3rd I give to Nancy Turners daughter Richard Turners an-
-father bed & cover striped ticks one bolster with 2 pillows &

4th I give to Nancy Spattling daughter of Jas Spattling an-
-father bed & blue striped ticks 1 bolster & two pillows

5th I give to Benjamin Nicholas fifty Dollars


6th I give to the Rev. Nathack Lowrey twenty five Dollars
 7th I give to the Rev. David Montgomery twenty five Dollars
 8th My will & desire is that after my death the land
 whereon I now live except the part conveyed as aforesaid,
 with all my stock of ~~Swine~~ Cattle Horses & Hogs
 with all my house hold & kitchen furniture with all
 my Estate not herein disposed of be sold by my Exors
 and all my just debts paid out of the proceeds, with
 the donations as above made & all the remaining
 balance paid over to my Sister Nancy Justice her
 lawful heirs of her body -

I do hereby appoint William McShorles & John Robins-
 son my sole Executors to this my last will & testament
 hereby revoking all former wills by me made in
 Confirmation whereof I have hereunto set my hand &
 seal this 17th day of August 1829.
