Court of Ordinary for said County - appointing us to make an
equal distribution of part of the Estate of William Powell de-
ceased. vizt. five Negroes. Rachael a woman and four
children. Lucy, Esther, Mariah and Pleasant. on which
purposes we John W. Smoore, Matthew Lyle and James
Pinkard met on the day above written and divided
as follows. -

Susanna Powell and John Powell to have negro
Rachael and pay sixty six dollars sixty six and
said. Nancy Powell to have ^{negro} pleasant. -

James Powell to have negro Lucy and pay eight
dollars thirty three and half cents to John Powell
and the said John Powell to have negro Mariah
Thomas Powell to have negro Esther and pay John
Powell thirty three dollars thirty three and half cents
