Lacey and my son Samuel I. Lacey the following Negroes (to wit) Betty and P. and children (Pole, Eliza Monarchy and John to be equally divided between them after paying the fees and expenses of Physicians for attending me during my illness to them & their heirs for ever.

I hereby nominate and appoint my friend Mr. George Miller the Executor to this my last will & Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 7th Decr. 1816.

John Buckner's Will

In the name of God Amen I John Buckner of the State of Georgia and County of Jones being in a Low State of health but sound in mind and memory and knowing man has once & so to die think proper to make and obtain this my last will and Testament my first I wish all my just debts to be paid. I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Buckner the one Half of a Lot of Land one hundred and thirty Seven which I now Live on during her life time then to my son Benjamin Buckner also I give and bequeath to my wife a negro woman named Phillis a negro girl named Shenshan also a negro girl named [unclear] and her daughter Mary also one bay horse one brown [unclear] and one [unclear] also seven head of Cattle and four head of sheep and one head of Hogs. Three Beds & Furniture all my

house hold & kitchen furniture also all my plantation
which above named property I live and bequeath to my wife
Mary Buckner during her life time and then to be sold for cash
and the money to be equally divided among my legal heirs

Nehemiah's Durn's Will

In the name of God Amen, Nehemiah Durn, of the State
of Georgia, and County of Jones, being weak of body but of
sound mind & memory hereby revoking all other wills, do
make and ordain this my last will & Testament in the man-
ner following (to wit)

I then 1st I bind to my beloved wife Anna Durn during
her natural life all that part of the tract of Land whereon
I now reside in the County aforesaid lying South of Shoal
Creek between said Shoal Creek Hog Creek & Cedar Creek to-
gether with the priviledges of the mills and mill seats on said
Shoal creek up to high water mark on the other side. also
bound unto her my said wife Anna Durn two negroes name-
ly Jack and Ritted and one Black Horse with half the Stock
of Hogs and cattle that I may be in possession of at my
death and as much of my house hold & kitchen furniture
as she may think proper to retain and each of my mar-
ried children to be furnished with one horse and saddle
one bed & furniture and two cows and calves
