We certify that the following is the substance of what Mrs. Sarah Richardson wished to be considered as her last will and testament - first - At the death of her parents five of the negroes bequeathed to them to be inherited by her niece Martha Pickling now in Canton, and the other five to be hired out for the benefit of Mrs. Wyche and her female children. And secondly the land on which her parents live, to be the property of her present husband.

Thomas Morris's Will.

In the name of God Amen - I Thomas Morris of the County of
 Jones Georgia, do make and constitute this my

last will and testament. 2^{ndly} I wish all of my property kept together for the use and support of my family and thirdly I wish no sale of any part of my perishable property, house hold and kitchen furniture, and stock of any description during the natural life or widowhood of my wife Ann Morris - and fourthly I in case of her dying or moving there an equal division of my whole estate to be divided between my wife and children and they all to share and share alike - and fifthly in case my wife marries, the balance of the estate will be divided between my children, as the oldest becomes of age, for him to have his portion and so on to the next oldest, till the youngest becomes of age. Sixthly, My wife's father and mother to live on the plantation and be supported out of my estate, during their natural lives - and lastly I appoint my wife Ann Morris my Executrix ~~then~~ of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof, hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty third day of February Eighteen hundred and thirty one.
