 to him & his Heirs forever

I Give to my son Joseph Stinson & his  
 Heirs forever three Negroes to Witt Daniel,  
 Betty & Crook & their Issues -

I Give to my Daughter Nancy Louisa dur-  
 ing her life four Negroes, to Witt, Sabra  
 Sally, Henry & Elias, and after her death  
 to be equally divided between the Heirs of  
 her body to them & their Heirs forever & also  
 the Issue of the said four Negroes -

I Give to the Heirs of my daughter Jean Talson  
 deceased the eight Negroes which she  
 in her possession at her decease to Witt  
 Josay, Nancy, Thome, Thomas Daniel, Betty  
 Peter & Nicholas to them & their Heirs forever

I Give to the Heirs of my son Alexander  
 Stinson deceased five Negroes to Witt Betty
