Millan of the said State & County, being of full age, out of sound & disposing mind and memory, knowing that I must shortly depart this life, deem it right & proper, both as respects my family and myself, that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, & I do therefore make this my last Will & Testament, hereby revoking all others. By me hereunto made,

First, I desire and direct, that all my just debts, be paid, without delay by my Executors hereinafter named and appointed,

Secondly, I give, and bequeath and devise to my beloved Mother, Flora M. Millan all of my entire estate consisting of Land, Negro, Horse, Mule, Cow, & Hogs being in the 707 district G.M. during her natural life only, I also give & bequeath to my beloved Mother in the same revised manner, the farming utensils used on and belonging to the said estate.

Thirdly, After the death of my Mother, I give, bequeath and devise to the Children of Murdock M. Castile my entire estate, which is to be equally divided between said Children, with the exception of my Watch & chain that is to be given to their son J. P. M. Castile.

Fourthly, I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Murdock M. Castile Executor to the my last Will and testament.
