 or said premises if living the place in which I
 now live. all the Outhouses &c. that is due by
 Acts of law account or otherwise I will to her
 during her life time or life. But in case she
 should die then I will that all of the property
 of any to be equally divided between
 my son Jesse Ann Harris and Daughter Elizabeth
 Harris. But in case my Wife Polly Ann Harris
 not marry she is to keep all of the above property with
 to her natural life, & then the property divided between
 my son Jesse Ann Harris & Daughter Elizabeth Harris
 as above. I do hereby constitute and appoint Jesse
 Ann Harris and John B. Harris my Executors to this
 my last will & testament. In presence of
