I Arthur Dillard being of sound mind and memory and of a disposing disposition and knowing as I do that God has appointed unto all men once to die do hereby order, constitute and appoint this my last will and testament
1st I give to my wife Polly Dillard the lot of land no (117) with all the improvements thereon with the stock of cattle hogs sheep and pigs and one bay horse one sorrel horse and one sorrel mare and mule colt and one negro man name Jim and a boy name John a boy Jacob and a woman named Charlotte all the plantation tools and carriages to dispose of at her death by well as she may think proper the land excepted after her death the land to belong to Thomas S. Dillard
2^d It is my will that a note I hold against John A. Dillard for two hundred and thirty nine dollars be given to him and that with what he has received from _____ Nancy Hamm has received her share
3^d I do Elizabeth Jolin a negro woman named Leah and two hundred dollars to be then share
4th Arthur Dillard Jim to have one negro man named Dick

Henry Dillard to have one negro man named Bill and Sarah W. Garbrough to have one negro man named Lewis and Frances L Dillard to have one negro girl named Ann and one boy Columbus when of age or marries and to remain with her mother for her board and clothing I desire that the nine creek tract of land 242 1/2 acres be divided between Arthur Dillard and Sarah W Garbrough as follows Commencing at the north east corner running to the Creek thence down said Creek to the mill coming on a big white oak on the west bank of the Creek thence south til it strikes the south line Arthur Dillard to have the east part and Sarah W Garbrough to have the west part and each to be equally intitled to the mill. Cost given house

I give to Joseph H Dillard and Henry Dillard lot of Land no 179 to be divided north and south Joseph to have the east half I also give to Joseph one pided mare and to Henry one pided horse I also desire that my wife Polly Dillard give to Joseph Henry Sarah and Frances bedding and furniture to make them equal with those that have had the being the judge

I give to Frances one mare and mule cart, the gray horse and crop of cotton to be sold at the highest bidder to have the mather and iron mows and security all to remain on the plantation under the care of my wife Polly Dillard until 25th of December next then to be divided as specificide

I do hereby Ordain Constitute and appoint my wife Polly Dillard my sole executrix to execute this my will

In the name of God Amen. I William Hanson of the State of Georgia and County of Monroe, considering myself to be fast on the decline of life, though in perfect mind and memory, and calling to mind the mortality of my body knowing that it is once appointed that all men should die, and as touching such things wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with, do give, demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form (to wit). First of all I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, and my body to the ground to be buried in a Christian like manner by my Executor hereafter named. Secondly I do make and ordain my loving son Enoch Hanson my lawful Executor Revoking all others. It is my desire that my Executor pay all legal debts, it is my desire that my loving wife Ann should keep all of my property during her life, or widowhood, and at the expiration of either all of my property to be sold to the best advantage, and equally divided between the lawful begotten heirs of my body, and my grand son William Martin, and if William Martin should die without issue, his part to be equally divided among the rest of my lawful heirs. It is my desire that the part of my estate that should be coming to my daughter Betsey Ann Miller should be equally divided among the lawful begotten heirs of her body.
