I Augustus G. Smith of the County and State aforesaid being sound in mind and knowing the uncertainty of human life doth make this my last will and testament.  
First. I will and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition, with a Head Stone erected at my grave showing the time of my birth & death. My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope for eternal salvation through the blessed Lord our Savior Jesus Christ whose religion I have professed and I humbly trust enjoyed.  
Second. I Will and direct that all my estate remain together as one mass Stock for the joint use of my beloved wife Martha and my two sons John Richard and Augustus to be improved in the best manner possible at the discretion of my Executor hereinafter named until such time as my wife shall marry, then I will direct that all my lands and all other property whatever, except negroes and the real proceeds divided equally between my wife Martha and my two sons John Richard and Augustus, my wife to receive one third the remaining two thirds to be equally divided between my two sons when the oldest arrives at lawful age.  
Third. I will and direct when my wife shall marry that my negroes be divided in three equal lots, my wife Martha to receive one lot the remaining two thirds to be equally divided between my two sons John Richard and Augustus when the oldest shall arrive at lawful age.
