I William Malone of the County of Gwinnett State of Georgia being in a sick and low condition but of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament hereby Revoking all others

- 1st It is my will that my Executors do sell as much of my property and such of it as they may think can best be expended as will be sufficient to pay all my last debts
- 2nd It is my will that my loving and my children do have free and peaceable possession of all the rest of my property after paying my debts.
- 3rd It is my will that the rest of my property be equally divided between my loving wife and all of my children to wit as any one of my children survives or marries off then that child is to have an equal part of what property there is at that time undivided

- 4th It is my will that my loving Wife and children do live on and enjoy my house and plantation as long as my Executors may think it is for the best But if my Executors at any time think it is best to sell the tract of land I now live on they are hereby authorized to do so, and to purchase a comfortable home for my Wife and children such as they think ~~will~~ suit them better than the one I now live on.
- 5th It is my will that my negro Woman Marsh shall not be lotted off to any one of my children during the natural life of my widow of my living Wife but that she remain in general stock as a part thereof
- 6th It is my will that if my living Wife should think proper to alter her condition by Marriage then and in that case it is my will that she receive an equal share of my property with my children
- 7th It is my will that my children shall be decently raised clothed and have Common English Education.
- 8th I do appoint my living Wife Polly Malone Executor and my Friend Douglas Watson Executor to this my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this Twenty third day of December in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and fifteen
