2. To Annie daughter of the said Charles B. Martin deceased, I bequeath Five Shares of the aforesaid Factory stock to be saved to her own use free from all control.

3. To Hattie also daughter of the said Charles B. Martin senior deceased I bequeath Five Shares of said Factory stock to be secured to her in like manner as the said Annie.

To Marie Deabrice, daughter of my son George Robertson Junior and Annie his wife all of Blackhear in Pierce County and State of Georgia, I bequeath Five Shares of the said Factory stock which desire may be deposited in some court savings bank or trust company where the interest accruing shall be added to the principal until the said Marie Deabrice shall become of age or is married, the accumulated interest and principal to be then paid over to her sole use and benefit free from the control of her husband or any other person.

5. To Anna wife of my son George Robertson Junior, as a small testimony of my regard, I bequeath the Five Shares of the aforesaid Factory stock.

6. To Marshal Martin son of Charles B. Martin senior, as a very small expression of my approbation of his conduct since the death of his father and the care he has exhibited for his debilitated orphans sisters, I bequeath the Five Shares of Factory stock.

7. To Harriett and Lucy Martin Sisters of Charles B. Martin Senior before named, I bequeath each one hundred Dollars, and to

Wortham, sister of the above said wife of Buchanan Wilcox of Charleston  
South Carolina also One Hundred Dollars.

The residue of my property, lands and stock (tho' being real estate)  
after payment of my medical and funeral expenses, my debts I may owe  
I have none at present and the balance to hand before mentioned, which  
I desire and direct to be paid to my said sister or in other delay in view of which  
I have made the said sister part of my bequest only to receive transfer  
of the same to my said sister's heirs, heirs at law and I hereby  
authorize and empower my said Executor under the will

to pay to my said sister or to the my said will and  
to the said sister's heirs, heirs at law in the margin by me  
hereby appointed and named the first day of February  
next to the City of Savannah and to the heirs
