

David Griffin of the County of Polk State of Georgia do make ordain and publish this my last will and testament hereby making all former wills made by me at any former time as follows to wit: First that all my just debts and burial expenses be paid in so far as practicable. Second I give and bequeath unto Martha J. Griffin my daughter in law widow of my deceased son William Griffin all my plantations and settlement of land consisting of and embracing the following lots of land to wit nine hundred and ninety two (992) eight acres of east side of nine hundred and ninety one (991) nine hundred and thirty five (935) nine hundred and thirty six (936) and nine hundred and sixteen (916) in the twenty first district (21st) of the third Section of originally Blewhee now Polk County for her use and the use of her children Tho^s W. Griffin Maryth. Griffin David G. Griffin Sarah G. Griffin and Jackson Griffin for and during her natural life or widowhood at her death or marriage to become the absolute property of the said children together with all the stock tools implements household and kitchen furniture of which I may be possessed of at the time of my decease. Third I give and bequeath to my daughter Susan Wright and my son Jackson Griffin each two hundred dollars to be paid to them by Martha J. Griffin or the Guardian of her children in case of her death or marriage in five years from the date of this my last will and testament. Fourth I appoint my son Jackson Griffin and William Hubbard executors of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have this day set my hand and affixed my seal this the 3rd day of January 1867. David Griffin
