Liddell Polk County I was present on the 30th day of June 1881 at the residence in Ledbetter Polk County State of Georgia of Mrs. Susan Walthall an unmarried woman and not long before her death about (24) Twenty four hours before her death in perfect possession of her mental faculties as appeared to us. Said Mrs. Susan Walthall called upon the by standing before the undersigned in particular to remember and take notice of what she was about to say when she said that she wished us to understand that her will and desire was that Mrs. Mary Lou Liddell the wife of Dr. Joseph A. Liddell and the adopted daughter of her late husband Edward H. Walthall should have take and possess all her property of every description whatsoever including real and personal property & choses in action to her own proper use benefit and behoof. This statement was made by Mrs. Susan Walthall in her last illness at her residence as above stated and under a full consciousness of her approaching death when she was too weak & feeble to appear in to death for her will to be written and she died in about Twenty four (24) hours thereafter. In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands this the 11th day of July 1881 Just then (10) days since the death of Mrs. Walthall
