In the name of God, Amen. I Benjamin H. Ham of the County of
Troup and State of Georgia, do hereby declare and man-
ifest my mind, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and
ordain this my last will and Testament.

First, I give my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave
me a body to be kept from sinners it was taken.

Secondly, as touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased the Lord to
bless me with in this life, I give and bequeath in manner and
form following. First, my will and desire is that all my just
and lawfull debts be paid as also my Funeral Expenses.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to the Georgia Baptist Convention
One Thousand Dollars to be applied to the education of young
Ministers of the Gospel to be paid by my Executors in four
equal annual Instalments from the date of my Death.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath to Mary L. Buller one hundred
Dollars to be paid by my Executor when she becomes of age.

Fourthly, I give and bequeath to Sarah Ann Buller one hundred
Dollars to be paid when she becomes of age as above.

Fifthly, I give and bequeath to Margaret T. Buller one hundred
Dollars to be paid by my Executor when she becomes of age.

Sixthly, I give and bequeath to my friend James Buller all
the Balance of my money together with all my good Estate
whatever. Lastly, I constitute, ordain and appoint James Buller

my whole and sole Executor of this my last will and Testament.

Relieving and confirming this and no other to be my last

will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto

set my hand and seal this fifth day of January 1851.
