as possible after which I wish my beloved

remainder of my effects during her widowhood

that said effect may be equally distributed
amongst my beloved children - I also
desire that my son James may get ~~some~~
or procure the assistance of some respectable
man and that they may together see
that the foregoing is faithfully carried
out - I also desire that James may
have his horse ~~and~~ Mordecai and
and John Henry, when they become of age
may have a horse bridle saddle pur-
-chased or procured for them - also they
together with my younger daughter may
have a good common Education as
good as most of the children
