he wanted Pryor Eawaray's son James &
Morris Eawaray's son to have - and that
he wanted William Eawaray son of
Morris Eawaray to have his broad cloth
coat as it fitted him the best - deceased
upon being interrogated about his money
in South Carolina said that he wanted
the children there (meaning his sister
Sarah Syles children to wit Nancy Elmira
George & Washington, and James Marion
Syle) to have it in part and that he wanted
Nathan Lipscomb to be his Executor
